

### **Direct Port Delivery at JNPCT**

1. Under ease of doing business, JNPT issued Trade notice on 09.02.2016 to extend the DPD facility to all ACP Clients irrespective of their monthly volume in order to extend the benefit of DPD to more number of importers and to reduce the handling cost at JNPT. Prior to issue of Trade Notice on 09.02.2016, 11 agencies were availing DPD facility from JNPCT.
2. Subsequently 629 have registered for availing DPD facility.
3. Details of monthly DPD volume handled at JN Port Terminals during 2016-17 is given below:

4. By facilitating DPD, importers get the following benefits:
    - i) The prompt and timely delivery by the Port Terminals will help in reducing inventory cost.
    - ii) Saving in transportation from Port Terminal to Customs bound warehouses.
    - iii) Handling and storage charges at warehouse.
    - iv) Container detention charges payable to Shipping agencies.
    - v) Delivery of DPD container at Port Terminals is on 24x7 basis which is not possible in custom bounded warehouses.
    - vi) Saving towards dwelling of boxes till clearance at destined custom bound warehouses. The average dwell time of import laden containers moved locally by road is 1.6 days at JNPT (all three terminals put together) as against 7-9 days in JNPT eco system i.e. the time between landing at Port Terminal to receipt of container from warehouses.
- Aforesaid benefits collectively result in saving of approx. Rs. 25,000/- to Rs. 40,000/- per container to the importer.

5. The procedure for registration of DPD agency at JNPCT is given below for the benefit of the Trade:

- i) The importer who intend to avail DPD facility from JNPCT shall have to submit duly filled the registration form along with following documents to get themselves registered initially:
  - a) Self-attested copy of permission issued by Jawahar Customs, Nhava Sheva for DPD facility.
  - b) Self-attested copy of Pan Card.
  - c) Letter of authorization of CHA for carrying out clearance of containers.
  - d) List of authorized signatures for the company on letter head.
- ii) The documents for registration can be submitted at the office of Chief Manager (Traffic), 1st floor, Administration building, JNPT, Sheva. Alternatively they can send colour scanned copies to [jnpctdpd@inport.gov.in](mailto:jnpctdpd@inport.gov.in) or [cfsjnpt@gmail.com](mailto:cfsjnpt@gmail.com).
- iii) Upon scrutiny of the documents (which are mandatory to be submitted for the first time registration), the DPD agency will be registered in the system and a DPD code will be provided by JNPT to enable importer to provide the same to the concerned Shipping Agency to indicate the same in the Import Advance List submitted to JNPT for a particular vessel.
